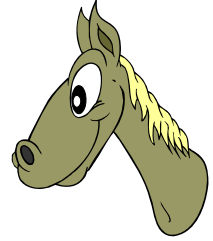


# Got Ulcers?



Does your horse exhibit any of the following symptoms?

- Low grade or reoccurring bouts of colic
- Decreased appetite &/or weight loss problems
- Poor hair coat
- Depressed, lethargic
- Poor attitude, behavior problems, cribbing
- Performance problems
- Sore or sensitive in the girth, rib cage, withers/saddle areas

If so, then there is a possibility that your horse may be suffering from **EGUS** – “Equine Gastric Ulcer Syndrome”. While the above symptoms may be due to other causes, the only way to find out for sure is to have your horse’s stomach examined with an endoscope.
